3. Attempt a critical appreciation of the following passage commenting on its content and style :

I do not believe that every boy and girl is potentially able to be good at science. I am aware, for instance, that my incapacity to master mathematics was not due to laziness or stupidity but to the fact that my brain cells were not disposed in that sort of pattern. Thus, although I was quick and deft in such subjects as the classics, history, foreign languages and literature, I was absolutely hopeless at algebra. If under the new system science alone is to lead educational advancement, then what happens to those who are born with unscientific minds? The scientist would, I suppose, contend that such nitwits need not be considered and that they are mere encumbrances in the modern world of machines and satellites. Yet if they remembered their history better, they would also know that many of the great men of the past, who have conferred immense benefits on the human race, could never understand why it should be that two and two make four.
