

CELEBRATION OF CONSTITUTIONAL DAY IN SAKUS MISSION COLLEGE



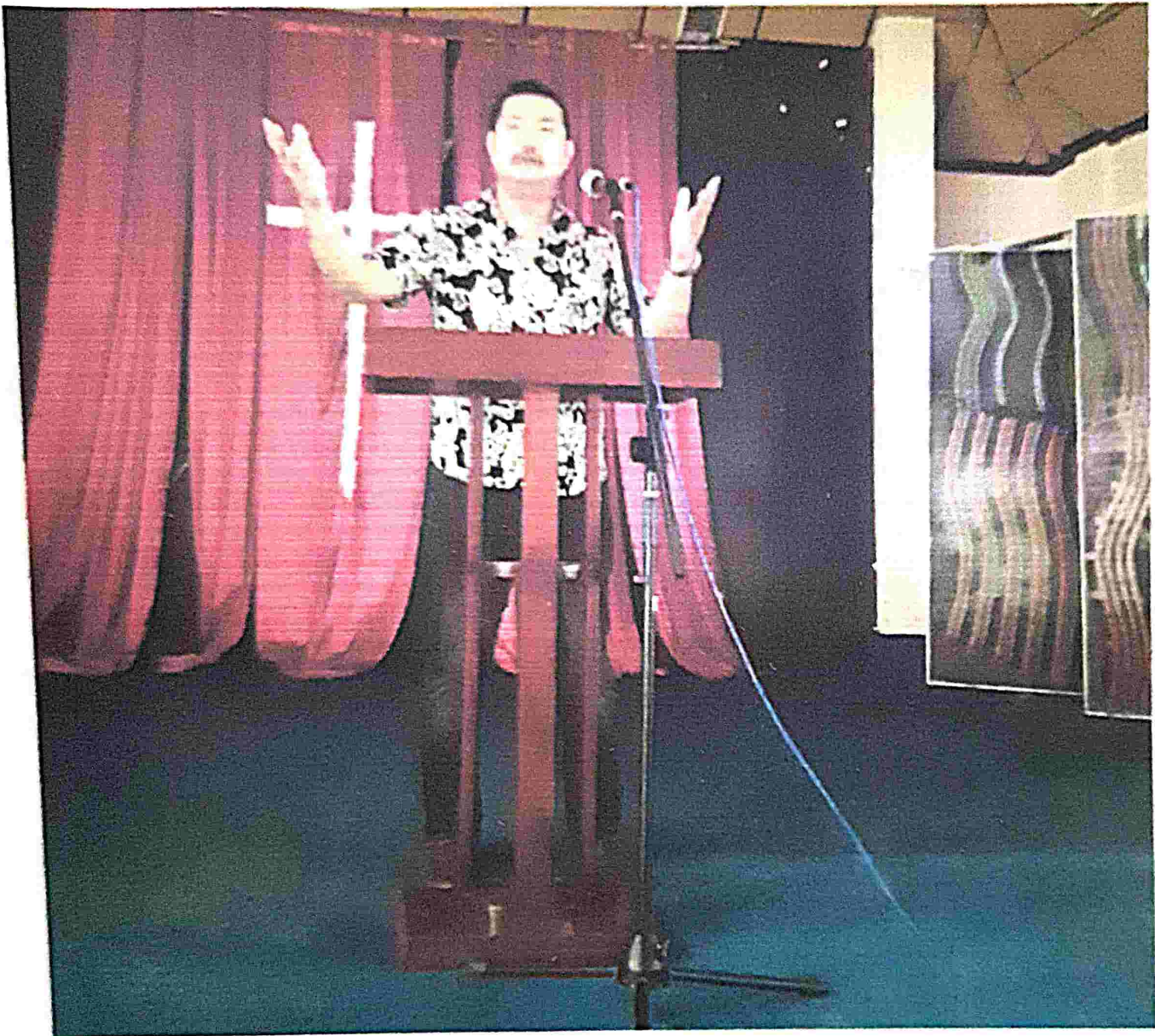
The Dept. of Political Science, Sakus Mission College organized its first constitutional Day on 26th of Nov 2019 to inculcate in the students the importance of constitutional values.

The speaker also exhorted the youth to promote, reclaim and save one's roots from extinction. The program began and ended with short prayers.'

The Student Christian Movement of India attended an international cultural exchange programme between SCMI members of India and Germany from 10th to 24th of June 2019. The main objective of the event was to get acquainted with the cultural diversity of one another. The convention was hosted at various venues at Germany. Altogether 12 students and 2 faculty members of SCMI represented India, and 11 students and 2 faculty members participated from Germany.

Presentation and seminars were part of the activities. **Miss. Jerina Yepto**, a member of SCMI of **Sakus Mission College India**, also participated in the presentation on the topic '*The geographic of India, dance, festival and political affairs*'.

The first five days event from 10th to 15th of June was conducted at **Bonn Germany**, where various activities like – Walk & Talk in Botanical Garden, morning devotion, City rally, Family hours visits, Indian evening, Boat ride & hiking were organised, Also Cologne cathedral was visited.

From 16th to 20th of June, various historical buildings & places were visited at **Berlin** -like Berlin city tower, Berlin wall, Bread for the world, Memorial for Jews, German Parliament, Town Hall, Television tower, Humboldt University, Orchestra & entertainment venues.

It culminated with an intensive International event at **Dortmund** from 21st to 24rd of June, where Kirchentag, a church Convention from across the world was held in Dortmund, under the 2019 theme as "What confidence is this". Highlights of the programmes comprise of Market opportunities, Bible studies, Worship, Daytime prayer concerts, International conference panels of discussion based on migration, Climate Change, Women rights etc.. were the core topics of discussions. On the whole, **Ms Jerina Yepto** remarked with excitement that, the entire 15 day long intellectual exchange programme was an unforgettable, enriching experience.

DIMAPUR, MAR 4 (NPN): Sakus Mission College (SMC) Eco Club in collaboration with Dimapur Municipal Council (DMC) has undertaken the mission to make the stretch of road from Nyamo Lotha Road to Deluxe Point Dimapur as "Litter free" since the last 13 days.

Interacting with the media on Wednesday, SMC HoD of Sociology Mhonthung said that students have been part of the mission through their own responsibility as well as to create awareness through action. He mentioned that at first the students started by picking up litters

and educating shopkeepers within the stretch to make use of the dustbin. Mhonthung also said that students have also pasted green leaf stickers at the doorstep of shops maintaining the dustbin.

In regard to the drawback in the mission, Mhonthung lamented that until and unless people inculcate civic sense and stop throwing thrash in moving car and unless the stretch was made tobacco free, it would be difficult to keep the area clean.

SMC Eco Club leader Vito 6th semester students and secretary Thujosgeli said that club took up the mission from last month February 21, saying that "It is our responsibility

to keep the city clean". They said that their mission was not just to clean the area but at the same time educate the traders, passersby as well as the students.

They also mentioned that they will continue with the mission till March 7, with the approach of the exam. The Eco Club team comprises of 44 active members who have been continuously carrying out the task after classes besides Sunday.

It must be mentioned that some shopkeepers provide refreshments to the Eco Club and passersby also give donations in appreciation of the efforts carried out by the young people.

DIMAPUR, MAY 12 (NPN): With shortage of buses to transport stranded citizens from Dimapur to other districts, the Ao Students' Union Dimapur (ASUD) took the initiative to arrange more than 10 buses to ferry stranded citizens from various community to Mokokchung district.

With thousands of stranded people wanting to go back to their respective

districts, the state government has not been able to cover all expenses due to shortage of NST buses.

ASUD with the help of institutions like Maple Tree School, Hope Academy and Saku Mission College were able to send at least 200 people on May 11 and May 12.

According to reports, the district administration paid for the fuel cost and all other expenditures were

made by the students including refreshment.

There are hundreds stranded and waiting to go back home, and more buses are needed, ASUD stated.

The students' body also raised apprehension that if the authorities were unable to handle inter-district stranded citizens, how would they cater to those returning from other states.
